5. Playground

- Laura long time chair secured upgrade to front of school
- Fundraising was matched by donor
- Laura has committed to finishing the project, although she is no longer actively on the PAC

6. Murray

- Large registration fluctuations caused some difficulty in the first two weeks
- September COVID exposures
 - Our school has the largest number of exposures to date.
 - Many requests are not within Murray's power; he is bound by VIHA / Ministry guidance and rules
 - Murray has been actively communicating concerns / anxiety he is hearing to the decision makers
 - Murray shares in parents frustration and anxiety; 95% of emails from parents are very supportive and grateful which has helped

Ouestions

- Are teachers allowed to remind kids to wear masks?
 - Yes and they provide masks as required
- Curious if classes who were in contact with the staff member who reported a positive test result have been contacted?
 - Murray does not know. This is VIHA's responsibility.
- Everybody has a different tolerance to risk. Some of us have been pre-emptive to the whole situation, pulling our kids early, etc. We are doing the best we can with multiple kids under one roof. Is there a way for us as parents who are willing to volunteer this information to give it and how can we give parents more information?
 - Per Murray, these are questions for the health authorities. He is strictly regulated by Island Health.

- Are all students in the 4 classes with covid at home?
 - If the child was present for days of exposure then they are required to stay home for 10 days
 - Siblings also allowed to attend school
- Cluster vs outbreak discussion; per Island Health:

- Cluster: Two or more confirmed cases within a 14-day period, with evidence of transmission occurring within the school and no other likely source of exposure (eg home or social contact).
- Outbreak: Multiple confirmed cases within a 14-day period, with evidence of ongoing transmission occurring within the school; Island Health's Medical Health Officer determines that exceptional measures are required to prevent further transmission of COVID-19.
- Teachers at SJD are also feeling frustrated for lack of information on other classroom exposures.
 - Murray's question in return: how does this knowledge change your day to day decisions?
 - We must always work with the assumption that COVID is coming into our classrooms everyday
